- Montsant is a blend of Garnacha (Grenache) and Carignan. The Garnacha is medium bodied with soft tannins, while the Carignan adds depth, color and spice to the blend.
- Montsant almost completely surrounds the more prestigious region of Priorat. It's less expensive than Priorat even though the vineyards are planted in the same soils with the same grape varietals.
- We don't use oak when producing the Montsant. This emphasizes the expressive fruit character. The winemakers are aiming for a light, fresh style of easy drinking red wine, similar to Beaujolais.
- Look for a distinctive minerality due to the dark shale soils that impart a depth of flavor.
- This wine can be served slightly chilled.
